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About this Issue

July 2002 Examinations: DOEACC O/A/B & C Level Examinations were conducted at 131 centres all over the country during July 13 - 23, 2002 successfully. About 82,480 candidates applied, out of which 81,337 were found to be eligible for the examination and were issued admit cards. The results of examinations for all the four levels were declared on 7th September 2002 (O Level), 14th September 2002 (A Level) and 25th September 2002 (B & C Levels) respectively on DOEACC Website: www.doeacc.org.in, which were accessed by the candidates on query basis.

January 2003 Examinations: The schedule for the next (25th) DOEACC Examinations to be held in January 2003 in respect of O/A/B & C Levels was announced in the leading newspapers through out the country in last week of August 2002. This issue gives the Date Sheet for the said Examination for the convenience of Students and Institutes.

Variable Accreditation Fee: DOEACC has introduced Variable Accreditation Fee and contribution of Awareness Creation Fund w.e.f. January 2003 Exams. Some clarifications are being provided through this Newsletter, based upon the feed-back received from a few Institutes in this regard.

Status of July 2002 Examinations

The 24th DOEACC Examinations at O/A/B/C Levels were conducted at 131 centres from 13th July 2002 to 23rd July 2002. 82,480 candidates applied for the said examination out of which 81,337 were found eligible and results were declared on 7th and 14th September 2002 for O & A Levels and 25th September 2002 for B & C Levels on DOEACC Website: www.doeacc.org.in

ACCREDITATION

Monitoring of the Institutes

DOEACC aims to provide an ideal learning environment for the students undergoing training in the institutions duly authorized by DOEACC Society. For the effective implementation of the training programmes under the DOEACC Scheme, information needs to be collected by the DOEACC experts on various aspects of the learning environment prevailing in the institutions to get a clear picture of the status of quality of education and training being imparted by these institutions in the non-formal sector of IT education. Towards this objective, DOEACC Society has initiated the process of monitoring the institutes authorized to conduct DOEACC Courses by organizing visits of experts to these institutes to assess them periodically.

In the first phase of this process, around 50 accredited institutes of Delhi Region and 20 institutes in Southern region have been visited.

In the second phase, institutes in Rajasthan, Punjab and J & K are being planned to be monitored.

As brought out that the Society has already introduced the monitoring system to ensure quality education & training by the institutes, based upon which an institute is being rated as Excellent/Very

Good/Good/Satisfactory/Poor on a scale of 0-200 as under:

This rating for an Institute will be valid for the period of Provisional/Full Accreditation and be reviewed periodically, so that an institute makes efforts either to maintain or improve upon its earlier rating.

Introduction of Variable Accreditation Fee

In order to ensure quality of IT education in the institutes accredited by DOEACC, it has been decided to introduce 'Variable Accreditation Fee' and Awareness Creation Fund'. A few clarifications have been sought from the institutions, which have been replied individually for the benefit of all the institutes. It is clarified that the contribution on the account i.e. Variable Accreditation Fee and Awareness Creation Fund is to be met by the institutes from their internal resources. Under no circumstances, any additional fee is to be charged from the students in any manner on this account. Had the idea been to charge the amount from the students, DOEACC could have increased the Examination Fee. It was not considered appropriate as that would have put additional burden on the students.

It is clarified that all the accredited institutes, both in private and public sectors, are abiding by the decision of the Society in this respect. No case has come to our notice wherein Variable Accreditation Fees or Awareness Creation Fund is being charged from the students.

A letter has been addressed to all the institutes providing the clarifications in this regard which is reproduced below:

Subject: Introduction of Variable Accreditation Fee (VAF) and Awareness Creation Fund (ACF) w.e.f. January 2003 Exams.

Sir,

This is in continuation to Society's Letter No. 2(15)/2002-DOEACC Society, dated 3rd June 2002 regarding introduction of Variable Accreditation Fee and Awareness Creation Fund with effect from January 2003 examinations (**Annexure A**).

2. In this regard, the Society is in receipt of a few queries from some of the institutes accredited to conduct DOEACC course(s). Therefore, in the fitness of things, it is thought necessary to share these queries (**Annexure-B**) and their clarifications with all the institutes as this would further facilitate institutes to implement both the said Schemes as envisaged.

3. It may be clarified that contribution towards both the schemes, i.e., the Variable Accreditation Fee and 'Awareness Creation Fund' should be met by the institutes from within their internal resources. Under no circumstances, the above fee is to be charged from the students in any manner whatsoever.

4. Accordingly, all the institutes should ensure that both Variable Accreditation Fee and Awareness Creation Fund are remitted to the Office of DOEACC Society along with filled-in examination application forms for January 2003 examination as per the details given in **Annexure-C**.

5. Should there be any further queries, please feel free to contact DOEACC Society and ensure that Examination Application Forms for January 2003 Examinations for all the Levels should reach DOEACC Society by October 30th 2002 (Afternoon) along with the above contributions. If the applications are received without the above contributions, appropriate action will be initiated in respect of concerned institutes, as per norms applicable to institutes authorized to conduct DOEACC Course(s).

Anneuxre - B

Q.1 When would the Scheme of 'Variable Accreditation Fee' be introduced?

A. The Scheme of 'Variable Accreditation Fee' is applicable w.e.f. January 2003 Examinations. (Refer last para of DOEACC letter No.2(15)2002-DOEACC Soc. dated 3rd June 2002).

Q.2 Is this Scheme applicable to only those institutes that have recently acquired accreditation?

A. No, this Scheme is applicable to all institutes accredited to conduct DOEACC course(s), irrespective of the date on which they have been granted accreditation.

Q.3 Would the extra amount pertaining to 'Variable Accreditation Fee' be charged with every bunch of Examination application Forms?

A. The Variable Accreditation Fee is to be remitted at the time of submission of Examination Application Form by the institute (Performa is placed at Annexure-C). Institutes are advised to submit the Performa duly filled-in, along with the filled-in Examination Application Form, accompanied by two separate Demand Drafts/Pay Order in respect of (a) Examination Fee, (b) Variable Accreditation Fee and Awareness Creation Fund.

Q.4(a) Students registered for O/A/B level would normally not appear in all the modules/papers together. He/she would require to undertake 2-5 separate examinations (depending upon the level) to appearing in the different modules/papers at least once. Therefore, is 'Variable Accreditation Fee' applicable only for the first examination or is it applicable for subsequent examinations as well?

Q.4(b) After the course is over, the student may still continue to appear through us, as his registration period may remain valid even after course completion, as owing to his personal reasons, he has failed or remained absent. In such cases for how long would the institute bear for the students?

A. The Variable Accreditation Fee is to be remitted by the institute for students' first attempt/appearance only for a particular level. This fee is not applicable for any subsequent attempts/appearances in the same level by the student. It may, however, be noted that VAF and ACF needs to be remitted, in respect of first attempt/appearance for each level of a particular level, i.e. irrespective of the number of examination that a student undertakes. Subsequently, VAF is applicable for only the first

attempt/appearance of a student in a particular higher level.

Q.5 If a bunch of Examination Application Forms is less than 25 students, would the 'Variable Accreditation Fee' be calculated on pro-rata basis?

A. No, not on pro-rata basis, the Variable Accreditation Fee & Awareness Creation Fund, is payable for a batch of 25 or part thereof, i.e. even, if a single form is forwarded by an institute, VAF should be remitted as applicable for a batch of 25 students/

Q.6 Is 'Variable Accreditation Fee' and Awareness Creation Fund the same Schemes?

A. No, Variable Accreditation and Awareness Creation are two distinct Schemes with separate fee structures. The fee structures of both the Schemes are defined at Annexure-A.

Q.7 Would this amount have to be charged from the students or would the institute bear it?

A. It may be clarified that contribution towards both the Schemes, i.e. the Variable Accreditation Fee and Awareness Creation Fund should be met by the institutes from within their internal resources. Under no circumstances, the above fee is to be charged from the students in any manner whatsoever.

Q.8 Reconsider the amount for Variable Accreditation Fee because in the proposed Scheme, the Institutions fielding more than 25 students by paying more against Variable Awareness Creation Contribution & Variable Accreditation Fee, will only share the increased financial burden on the DOEACC Society. Just consider, that an institute having 26 students, will have to pay Rs.8000/- for 26 students against these Fee?

A. While framing the Scheme, this aspect has already been discussed. The contribution towards the Variable Accreditation Fee and Awareness Creation are to be paid as per details given in Annexure-A.

Q.9 With the slow down in IT industry, it has become difficult to enroll students. In this regard, it is felt that introduction of two new Schemes with separate fee structures is too taxing?

A. This has already been examined. Additional funds generated shall be used for Awareness Creation only. Introduction of these Schemes will prove beneficial to both the DOEACC Scheme as also the institutes accredited to conduct DOEACC Course(s).

7. The Variable Accreditation Fee and 'Awareness Creation Fund' should be met by the institutes from within their internal resources. Under no circumstances, the above fee is to be charged from the students in any manner whatsoever.

Mutual recognition between DOEACC 'B' & 'C' level Examination and CITPM Associate Examination for Singapore Computer Society

An MOU has been signed between Singapore Computer Society (SCS), National Infocomm Competency Centre (NICC) / Ministry of Information, Communications & the Arts and DOEACC Society/Department of Information Technology for mutual recognition of DOEACC 'B' Level with three years experience and 'C' Level with one year experience in Project Management; with CITPM (Certified IT Project Manager) Associate Examination of Singapore Computer Society/National Infocomm Competency Centre, Singapore.

REGISTRATION

Rejection of Registration Forms

Our past experience shows that large number of forms get rejected on petty mistakes on the part of the candidates filling up the forms and the institutes are not giving proper attention to check the filled in forms before forwarding the same to the Society. Following are some of the tips to be kept in view while filling up of the Form or cross checking the same before being forwarded to DOEACC.

- Forms not signed by the applicant;
- The candidate not eligible;
- The attested copies of certificates of educational qualification not attached;

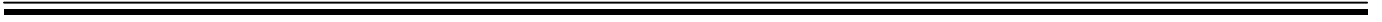
- The DD not attached/the DD attached is not for sufficient amount to meet the Registration Fee and mandatory charges for publication;
- DD not in favour of DOEACC or is not valid or issuing /drawee branch code has not been indicated;
- Name miss-match in the Registration Form and certificates of educational qualification.

All concerned are, therefore, requested to keep relevant instructions in view while filling up of the Registration Form to avoid rejections.
